Our very own Pat Hartman was one of the ten winners selected throughout the state of West Virginia! Below is a portion of the essay submitted by her son, Richard.



Pat Hartman was born in Clarksburg, WV and grew up in Huntington where she attended Cabell County Schools and Marshall University. Pat became active in the Civil Rights Movement during the 1960’s. This activism led her to successfully seek election to the Cabell County Board of Education. Returning to Marshall after thirty years she completed her degree, graduating cum laude in 1976. The same year she was elected to represent Cabell County in the West Virginia House of Delegates. Pat was re-elected in ’78, ’80, and ’82. She rose to serve as vice-chair of the House of Education Committee and chair of the Higher Education Sub-Committee. In 1978 she was appointed by Governor John D. Rockefeller IV to the Commission on Aging.

During her service in the West Virginia Legislature, Pat introduced over 100 bills, 25% of which became law. Pat worked passionately on behalf of women, children and seniors. She led the fight against drunk driving and domestic violence. Her legacy of legislative accomplishments and community service stands firmly on a lasting foundation committed to the protection of women from domestic violence, the importance of education and the provision of quality health care for West Virginia’s seniors.
